Navajo Weaving: Diamonds, Dreams, Landscapes

Opening May 29, 2009 at the University of Colorado Museum of Natural History

Comprised of three separate iterations, each displaying twenty to thirty Navajo textiles, this exhibit will showcase nearly 100 textiles from the Museum's spectacular collection of rare Southwestern textiles. The three iterations of the textiles will be divided into "Diamonds and Beyond," "Dreams," and "Landscapes," each focusing on a different design element found in Navajo textiles. Most of the textiles have never been displayed for the general public before.


