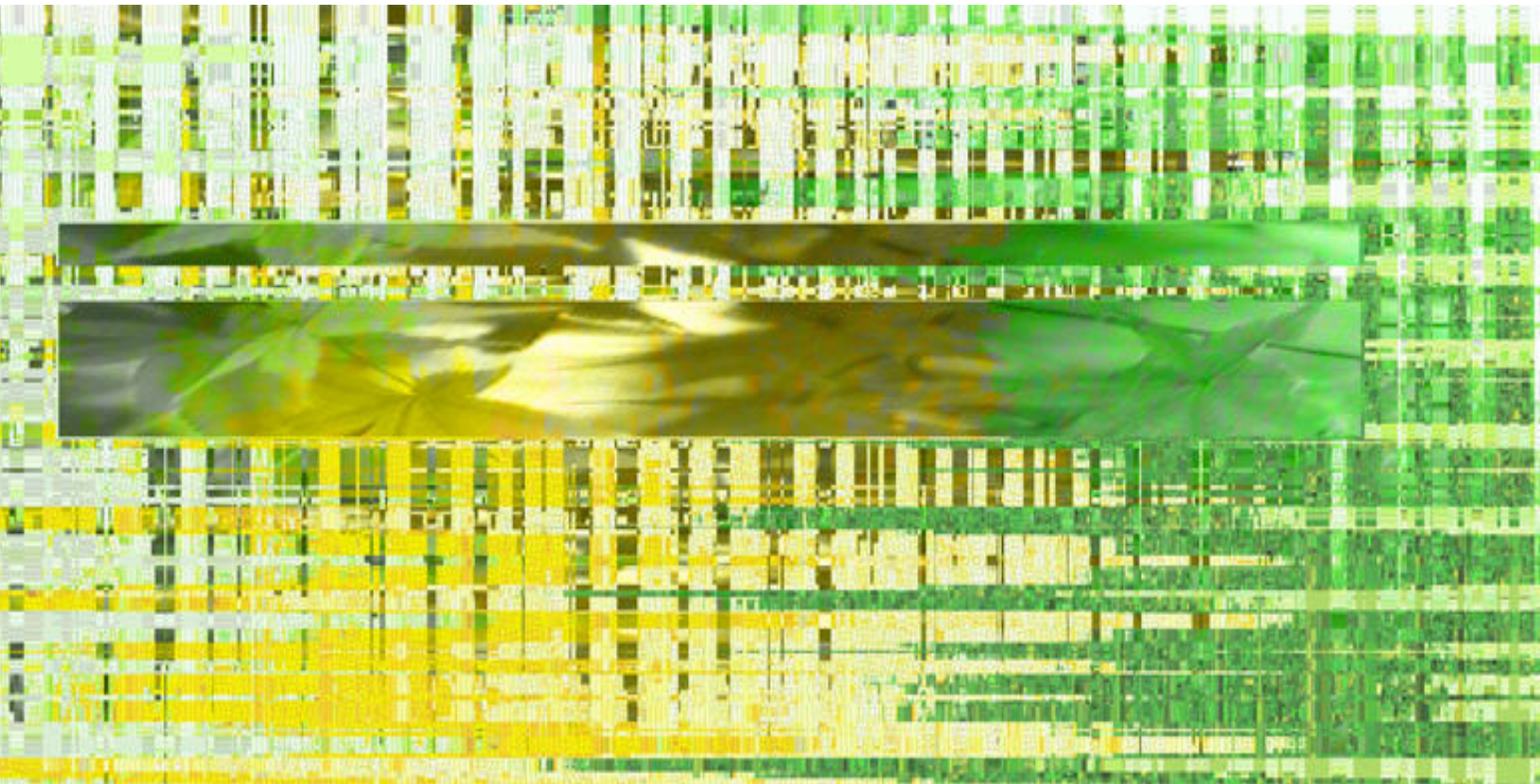

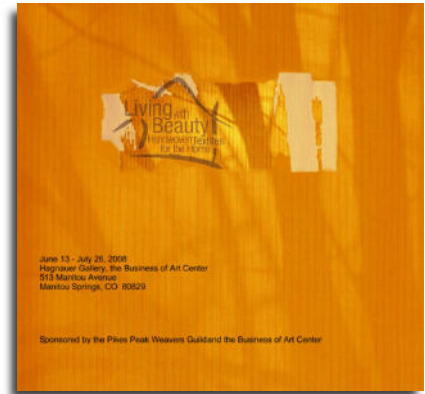

# September Sample

## Interlocked 8 Shaft Twill by WW Walker

Last year at the sale for Living With Beauty, I picked up a skein of rose colored mohair yarn and a cone of 8/2 Maineline wool yarn. My thoughts were to make a shawl for my mother. Then I got to thinking how much mohair sheds, so the shawl would have to be lined. I put the project on a back burner since I am not the greatest man with a sewing machine.

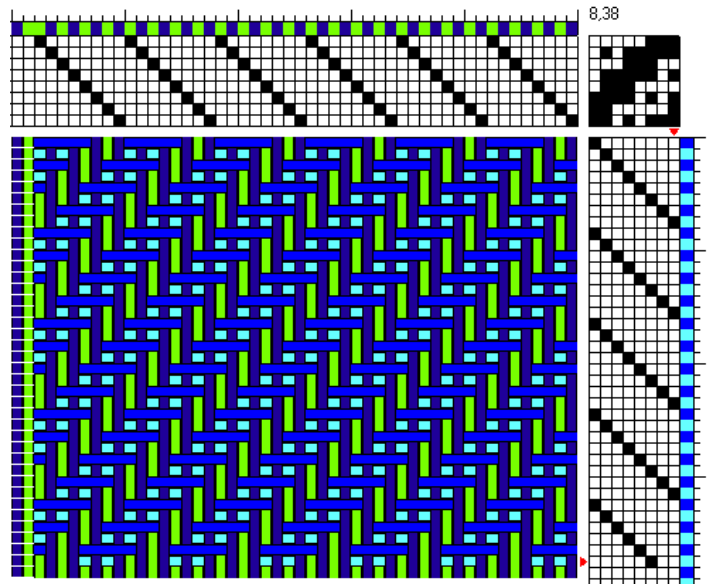
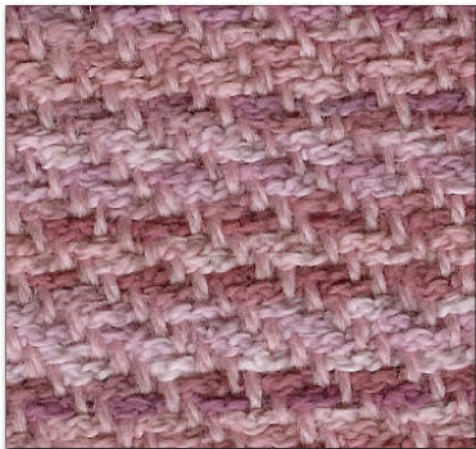
Enter Betsy Blumenthal and her workshop, *Two Sides Are Better than One*. This gave me the idea that surely there had to be a weave structure that would produce a two sided fabric. The answer was an 8-shaft interlocked twill weave found in

*The Key to Weaving*, pp 199, by Mary Black. Using my mystery mohair plus a variegated rose 100 percent cotton yarn for my weft and using the Maineline for my warp, I produced a beautiful fabric that is fuzzy on the outside but smooth on the inside. This is a double weave so the epi needs to be doubled, since half the epi is on the top layer and half on the bottom layer of your weaving.

This same structure can be done on 4 shafts using the instructions on page 198 of Mary Black's book. Basically the threading is the same only 1, 2, 3, 4.

The treadling on a direct tie up for 4 shafts would be:

1 1-2-3 2 1-2-4 3 1-3-4 4 2-3-4

## August Minutes & Committee Reports

August 7, 2008

### Board Meeting

Linda Shaffer called the meeting to order at 12:35 p.m. W.W. Walker, Barb Byerly, Dottie Weir, Jane Rock, Susan Bowman, Diane Fabeck, Sandy Hutton, Catie Kiley, Kathleen Orr, Beverly Weaver, Doreen McLaughlin, Louise Conner, and Emily Jones were present. The Board Meeting Minutes from May 9, 2008 were approved. Linda requested any changes to the agenda to be sent to her one week prior to the September meeting. The 2008/2009 agenda of programs scheduled for PPWG monthly meetings was discussed with an emphasis on the upcoming 50<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary of the Guild. The need for new PPWG membership brochures was reported followed by discussion of wording changes and additions. Demonstration Chairs will be responsible for brochures to be available at demonstrations. Brochures will be left at public libraries. Susan will e-mail a proposal document of the present PPWG brochure to all Board members for input. The success of the Rockledge Ranch participation for 2008 was reported. The September Newsletter will ask for volunteers for hospitality for the upcoming meetings. The library will have an annual review and update. The newsletter will be active two weeks prior to the September 12, 2008 meeting. Publicity will include membership brochures, newspaper, and radio advertisements. The Publicity Chair needs information about two months prior to the events. The addition of a PPWG blog and a link to the web site peakradar.com was suggested for the guild web site. February's workshop will be presented by Cindy Ruesink on 3 Shaft Weaving. A motion was made by Louise Conner that the Board accept funding recommendations made by Judi, Sandy, Barb, Linda, and Susan and that the Board recommend that the

Guild adopt the funding recommendations from the coverlet and Living With Beauty projects to be used for a laptop computer (\$600), a donation to Mountain View Church of Christ (\$200), and for photo editing of coverlet backsides (< \$50, if needed), with any remaining funds going into the Fund for Excellence in Fiber Art. The motion was seconded by W.W. Walker and the vote was unanimous to approve the motion. The Board agreed that the Memorial Fund and Fund of Excellence in Fiber Art guidelines will be added to the standing rules in the 2008-2009 directory as voted on by the guild previously. The Scholarship Application process will be added to the 2008/2009 PPWG Directory and web site. Meeting was adjourned at 2:35 p.m.

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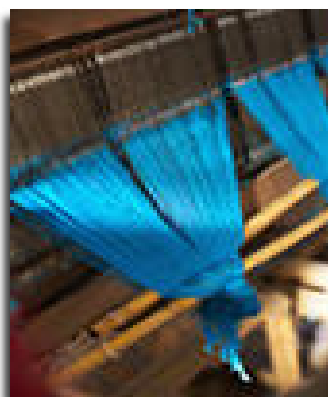
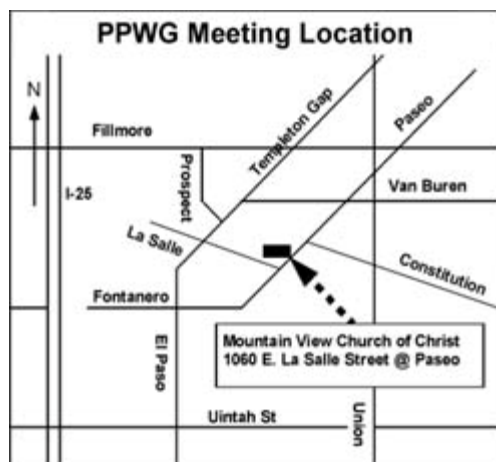

## Samples for 2008-2009

PPWG needs volunteers for weaving and spinning samples for the newsletter for the months below. At the August Board meeting, the board decided to also add dyeing samples for the newsletter. Hopefully we will always have a weaving sample and/or spinning/dyeing sample for each newsletter. For weaving, we need two (2) samples (6" x 6" minimum, 8" x 10.5" maximum). For spinning we need two (2) samples which need to be butterflies approximately 4 yards long. Dyeing samples may be on fiber or handwoven cloth. So the size of the sample will depend on the media.

Jane Rock will be scanning the samples for the newsletter. These need to be delivered to her the month before they are to appear in the newsletter. After scanning, she will bring the samples to the guild meeting to be placed in the sample notebooks in the library.



Your weaving and spinning descriptions need to be mailed or emailed ([doreen@divide.net](mailto:doreen@divide.net)) to the newsletter editor, Doreen McLaughlin. Linda will print the descriptions from the newsletter for the sample notebooks in the library. If you have other information for the sample notebooks, please give it to Linda at a meeting.
